


## Doors Open Minneapolis



Lakewood's **Welcome Center** is the first stop for many of the thousands of people who visit Lakewood each year. This Zero Energy Ready building features accessible family meeting rooms, a gallery for viewing art, and a dedicated space for community gatherings.

Don't miss the centerpiece of the cemetery, the **Memorial Chapel**, modeled after the Hagia Sofia and completed in 1910. Many experts believe that a work of such magnitude with its mosaiced interior composed of 10 million colorful tiles—could not be recreated at any price today, as artisans possessing the necessary skills have passed into history.







Tie a ribbon to the **Living Memory Tree**, a creative, collective way to honor the memory of loved ones.

## Completed in 1967, the **Memorial Mausoleum** is designed by Detroit architects Harley, Ellington, Cowan & Stirton using a blend of enduring Minnesota granite, bronze and steel.



After visiting architecture near Lakewood's entrance, experience the stunning **arboretum** around you, encompassing nearly 250 acres.
